

SHOW JUMPING NEWSLETTER 2010

Developing Horse or Rider Division Continues for 2010 Championships

Open to D-3s **and up**, minimum age 12 yrs., 2'9" – 3', two double combinations and no triple combinations. In the jump off round, the maximum height will not exceed 3'. All fences should have ground lines.

This division is designed as an entry level division for the developing rider or horse. Competitor must qualify for this division at a Regional Rally per the Show Jumping Rulebook.

The Show Jumping Committee requires the following:

1. **To qualify for Championships, all qualifying courses at Regional Rallies must reflect the technical aspects of a Championships' course.**
 2. The Show Jumping Committee strongly recommends that qualifiers have 12 or fewer jumping faults at their qualifying rally.
 3. NEW – The Show Jumping Committee strongly recommends that ONE OF THESE THREE ROUNDS be a Take-Your-Own-Line.
- **Reminder to All Qualifying Rally organizers** – Please remember to include on the TD/Steward's Report (found at <http://www.ponyclub.org/showjumpingtdreport.php> – Please do not use the one in the rulebook). Please list the name(s) of the course designer(s) and indicate that a minimum of 3 rounds were completed during the rally. Please list email addresses for each of the officials and course designers.
 - All entries sent to the Championships Secretary must include the Steward's report and the score sheets indicating 3 rounds for qualifiers.

MEDICAL ARM BAND RULES FOR USPC RALLIES:

Armbands with a USPC approved medical card in them shall be worn at all times while on the grounds at Championships. Competitors are responsible for bringing their own current USPC medical cards already in an armband.

Technical Delegates for all Rallies need to return the TD's forms to the USPC National Office. The completed TD report serves as documentation that a Regional Qualifying Rally meets the USPC requirements for a Qualifying Rally.
